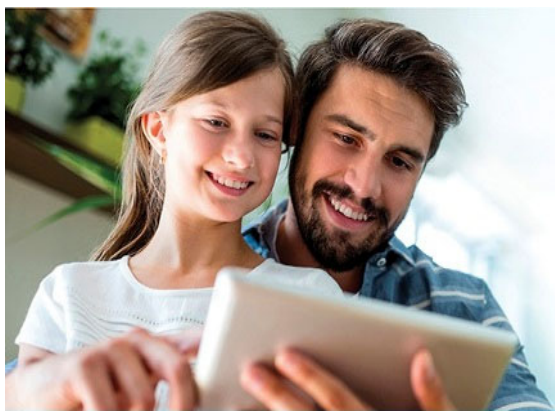

REFLECTIONS

A TIME FOR DEEPENING

The period before Christmas has that remarkable quality of joy that seems to touch not only Christians but all who live in our society....

But Advent is not only a period of joy. It is also a time when those who are lonely feel lonelier than during other periods of the year. During this time many people try to commit suicide or are hospitalized with severe depression. Those who have hope feel much joy and desire to give. Those who have no hope feel more depressed than ever and are often thrown back on their lonely selves in despair.

When a person is surrounded by a loving, supportive community, Advent and Christmas seem pure joy. But let me not forget my lonely moments because it does not take much to make that loneliness reappear. . . .

When Jesus was loneliest, he gave most. That realization should help to deepen my commitment to service and let my desire to give become independent of my actual experience of joy. COMFORT ZONE

“Comfort, give comfort to My people, says your God.” —Isaiah 40:1

The Lord commanded His heavenly court to give comfort to His people on earth. This “comfort” does not mean feeling good and indulging in “creature comforts,” but being freed from slavery to a pleasure-seeking lifestyle (see Is 40:2).

God’s comfort is not an exterior gratification of the senses but an interior freedom from sin and guilt (Is 40:2).

An angel obeyed God’s command to comfort His people by crying out: “Earthquake!” (That is probably what is meant by the reference to filling in the valleys and laying low the mountains in Isaiah 40:4.) A voice screaming “earthquake” does not seem comforting, but it shows that God’s idea of comfort is not based on circumstances.

Next, another voice, probably that of an angel, commanded Isaiah to cry out. Isaiah was understandably at a loss for what to say. He was told to cry out that “all mankind is grass” (Is 40:6). What a comforting thought! Obviously, God’s comfort is not based on human power.

Finally, Jerusalem is told to climb a high mountain and cry out at the top of her voice: “Here is your God!” (Is 40:9) Comfort isn’t a feeling, pleasure, circumstance, or human accomplishment. No matter what the circumstances, true comfort is being in the Lord’s presence and in a committed relationship with Him.

Prayer: Father, give me Your kind of Christmas comfort.

Promise: “It is no part of your heavenly Father’s plan that a single one of these little ones shall ever come to grief.” —Mt 18:14

Praise: It’s believed that a youthful St. Nicholas made a pilgrimage to Egypt to study with the Catholic Desert Fathers. Upon his return, he was ordained Bishop of Myra in Asia Minor.

Y’ALL COME

“To whom can you liken Me as an equal? says the Holy One.” —Isaiah 40:25

No one equals God in anything. Consider God’s strength; He is unequalled in strength. Almighty God is so strong that He made and sustains the billions and billions of stars which span light-years in space (Is 40:26).

Almighty God is willing to share His unlimited strength with us. “He gives strength to the fainting; for the weak He makes vigor abound” (Is 40:29). When God strengthens old or weak people, they can outrun, outwork, and outlast young folks. Those who let God renew their strength “will soar as with eagles’ wings; they will run and not grow weary, walk and not grow faint” (Is 40:31).

It gets better. God will make you so supernaturally strong that you will be able to say with St. Paul: “In Him Who is the Source of my strength I have strength for everything” (Phil 4:13). God’s love in you will be stronger than death (see Sg 8:6). Death, sickness, pain, and Satan will wear out before you will. You will have the strength to enter into eternal life and rest (see Mt 11:29).

To receive this supernatural strength, all people must come to Jesus. “All you who are weary and find life burdensome” (Mt 11:28), come to Jesus.

Prayer: Father, beginning this Advent may I have Your strength for everything.

Promise: “My yoke is easy and My burden light.” —Mt 11:30

Praise: St. Ambrose is a Doctor of the Church. He wrote extensively on topics ranging from repentance to the importance of the example set by holy virgin martyrs.

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REFLEXIONES

ZONA DE CONFORT

“¡Consuelen, consuelen a mi pueblo, dice su Dios!” (Isaías 40:1).

El Señor ordenó a su corte celestial que consolara a su gente en la tierra. Este “consuelo” no significa hacernos sentir bien y complacernos con “comodidades terrenales”, sino ser librados de la esclavitud de un estilo de vida en busca del placer (ver Is 40:2). El consuelo de Dios no es una gratificación externa de los sentidos, sino una libertad interior del pecado y la culpa (Is 40:2).

Un ángel obedeció a Dios para consolar a su gente gritando: “¡terremoto!” (Esto es posiblemente lo que significa cuando se refiere al rellenar los valles y aplanar las montañas en Isaías 40:4). Una voz gritando “terremoto” no parece dar consuelo, pero muestra que la idea de Dios sobre consuelo no se basa en las circunstancias.

Después, otra voz, probablemente de un ángel, le ordenó a Isaías que gritara. Isaías no sabía exactamente qué decir pues se le ordenó que gritara “toda carne es hierba” (Is 40:6). ¡Qué pensamiento tan consolador! Obviamente el consuelo de Dios no se basa en el poder humano.

Finalmente, se le dijo a Jerusalén que subiera una montaña elevada y gritara con fuerza: “¡Aquí está tu Dios!” (Is 40:9) El consuelo no es un sentimiento, un placer, una circunstancia o un logro humano. No importa cuáles son las circunstancias, el consuelo verdadero es estar en la presencia del Señor y en una relación comprometida con Él.

Oración: Padre, esta navidad, dame el tipo de consuelo del que me hablas.

Promesa: “De la misma manera, el Padre que está en el cielo no quiere que se pierda ni uno solo de estos pequeños” (Mt 18:14).

Alabanza: Se cree que el joven san Nicolás hizo una peregrinación a Egipto para estudiar con los padres católicos del desierto. A su regreso, fue ordenado obispo de Myra en Asia Menor.

INMACULADAMENTE CORREGIDOS | “Y nos ha elegido en Él, antes de la creación del mundo, para que fuéramos santos e irreprochables en Su presencia” (Efesios 1:4).

Necesitamos ser hechos “perfectos en nuestra santidad” e “irreprochables en todo su ser... hasta la venida de nuestro Señor Jesucristo” (1 Tes 5:23). Él Señor regresará para encontrar, “una Iglesia resplandeciente, sin mancha ni arruga y sin ningún defecto, santa e inmaculada” (Ef 5:27). Si hemos de mirar a nuestro Señor cara a cara en el cielo (Heb 12:14), debemos estar santificados e inmaculados en todo aspecto de nuestra conducta (1 Pe 1:15).

Nos volvemos santificados e inmaculados por ser bautizados en Cristo y recibiendo una nueva naturaleza humana en Cristo. Cuando pecamos después de haber recibido una nueva vida en Cristo, podemos ser rescatados inmaculadamente por el hecho de arrepentirnos de nuestros pecados, confesándolos, y aceptando el perdón de Dios. Viviendo una vida con Cristo y resistiendo las tentaciones, arrepintiéndonos de los pecados, y siendo purificados, nos convertimos en seres inmaculados. Si le hemos entregado totalmente nuestras vidas a Jesús, pero no hemos logrado ser inmaculados al morir, nos hará inmaculados en el purgatorio. Si es que vemos a Dios en el cielo, necesitamos que nos haga inmaculados por Su gracia (Heb 12:14).

El solemne día festivo de hoy, la Inmaculada Concepción de la Virgen María, nos enseña la necesidad y la esperanza de ser inmaculados. Él Señor hizo a Nuestra Señora Inmaculada desde su concepción. Esto sirve para animarnos en que Dios nos hará inmaculados después de ser concebidos, a lo largo de nuestras vidas, y antes o, si es necesario, después de nuestras muertes.

“Oh María, sin pecado concebida, ruega por nosotros que recurrimos a ti”.

Oración: Padre, “¡Lávame totalmente de mi culpa y purifícame de mi pecado!” (Sal 51:4)

Promesa: “Yo soy la servidora del Señor, que se cumpla en mí lo que has dicho” (Lc 1:38).

Alabanza: “Únicamente Tu y tu Madre son más bellas que cualesquiera otros; porque no hay mancha en Ti, ni manchas sobre tu Madre” (Los Himnos Nísibis, san Efrén, 370 AD).
