Did you hear about the pastor who prepared a great message on humility? But he was waiting for a bigger congregation to preach the sermon too! Another pastor was given an award for humility. A week later, the congregation returned the award because the pastor displayed it in his office!

Jesus was returning to Capernaum after journeying incognito through the Northern Province of Galilee, avoiding crowds and teaching the apostles. Mark presents Jesus as giving three predictions about His coming suffering and death. The first appears in Chapter 8, the second in Chapter 9, and the third in Chapter 10. The response by Jesus' disciples to each of these prophecies was a disappointment to Jesus. Their three refusals to accept the truth of what Jesus was prophesying rose from their assumption that Jesus was, of course, going to be a political, wealthy, powerful, military messiah who would usher in an earthly kingdom where they would be rich and powerful because they were so close to him! These wishful dreams would not permit their minds to take in the reality Jesus was teaching them—that the Kingdom would be brought to birth in His blood poured out on the cross as He willingly laid down His life in sacrifice, to free all of us human beings from sin and death.

Jesus says that people who serve humbly are the greatest. He uses a play on an Aramaic word that can mean either *servant* or *child*. Presenting a child before them, Jesus explains that one who wishes to be the first among them must be a *servant* to all. True greatness to which they, and we, are being called, consists in serving one's fellow man and is never self-centered. Instead, true greatness lies in the ability to see and respond to the needs of others, and it presupposes compassion and sympathy. The two conditions of true greatness to which Jesus calls us are humility and service. This calling, vocation, to humble, loving service belongs to the Church as a whole, and to every member of the Church individually

We must become great through humble, self-giving service. Greatness, in Jesus' view, is found in our willingness to accept, welcome and serve those who are considered unacceptable by reason of class, color, religion, language, wealth, or culture. We must welcome people the way a child welcomes them before he is taught discrimination. If we are to be truly great, we must be ready to accept four challenges: (1) to put ourselves last, (2) to be the servant of all, (3) to receive the most insignificant human beings with love, and (4) to expect nothing in return. “Learn from me for I am meek and humble of heart,” says Jesus to all of us. “What is the essential thing in the religion and discipline of Jesus Christ?” St. Augustine asks, and then responds, “I shall reply: first humility, second humility and third humility.” We should not seek recognition and recompense for the services we do for Christ and the Church as parents, teachers, pastors, etc. Trusting Faith resulting from true humility is essential for all corporal and spiritual works of mercy.” Here is the motto of the Missionaries of Charity, the order of nuns founded by Mother Teresa:

The fruit of Silence is Prayer.
The fruit of Prayer is Faith.
The fruit of Faith is Love.
The fruit of Love is Service.
And the fruit of Service is Peace.
 May God bless you all. Amen.



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RESPECT LIFE MINISTRIES

Dear followers of Christ,

The topic of abortion raises similar emotions and debates as chattel slavery did preceding the Civil War. But, unlike the protections contained in the 13th Amendment which finally abolished the horrors of slavery, innocent human life remains vulnerable and under attack in our country.

The consequences of “progressive” abortion laws have resulted in more than 64-million lives lost since 1973. That’s approximately equal to the combined populations of California and Texas. And while the abortion rate fell from a high of 36.4-percent of live births in 1984 to 20.4-percent in 2021, the abortion rate in this country is again trending-up.

Today, if you are a practicing Catholic who speaks-up and defends Church teachings on abortion, you are described (and sidelined) as a dangerous radical unfit for political office, judgeships, certain medical professions, journalism, and other influential careers. The litmus test is your position on abortion.

Attacks on the most innocent and vulnerable among us are not new. Recall that the Holy Family had to flee to Egypt to escape King Herod’s order to the murder innocent children which he felt threatened his political position and his personal independence. In the 20th century, the Soviet Union was the first modern country to legalize abortion. Since then, this great evil has spread across the planet, including the U.S.A.

Saint Mother Theresa of Calcutta, in her address to the U.S. National Prayer Breakfast in 1994 declared, *Any country that accepts abortion, is not teaching its people to love, but to use any violence to get what it wants. It’s a poverty to decide that a child must die so that you may live as you wish.*

We believe that God is love and if God so loved us, we must also love one another (John 4:8; 11). This love naturally extends to our children. *Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these* (Matthew 19:14).

Saint Pope Paul VI, in his encyclical Humana Vitae declared that *every action specifically intended to prevent procreation is forbidden, except in medically necessary circumstances. Therapeutic means necessary to cure diseases are exempted, even if a foreseeable impediment to procreation should result, but only if infertility is not directly intended.*

What can you do to oppose abortion and support life? First, get educated on church teachings and support a culture of life so that you can give testimony to the value of life. There are numerous prolife organizations online, not the least being the Diocese of Sacramento and Archdiocese of San Francisco. Next, send letters, emails and other communications to those in power to express your support for laws that protect life at all stages. Be present to those around you by defending life, including prolife marches and support of prolife organizations. **Vote prolife.** Pray.

The first three decades of the Joyous mysteries of the Rosary are particularly powerful in this effort. Say heartfelt prayers to notable prolife saints such as Gerard Majella, Maximilian Kolbe, Gianna Bereta Molla, Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Pope Paul VI, Pope John Paul II and of course, our Lady of Guadalupe whose miraculous image shows her pregnant with our Lord and Savior. Our Lady is also, most appropriately, the patroness of the prolife movement. Millions of native Mexicans converted to the Catholic faith and ended demonic human sacrifices because of her image on Juan Diego’s tilma.

Every child, born and unborn, is deeply loved by our Lord – who is the author of life.

Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.

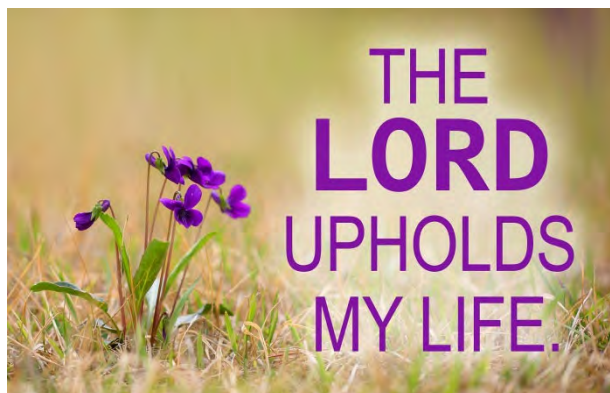

25 DOMINGO B: SI QUIERES SER GRANDE, SÉ EL ÚLTIMO | PADRE JOSÉ SEBASTIÁN CMI

¿Escuchaste acerca del pastor que preparó un gran mensaje sobre la humildad? ¡Pero estaba esperando que una congregación más grande predicara el sermón también! Otro pastor recibió un premio por humildad. Una semana después, la congregación devolvió el premio porque el pastor lo exhibió en su oficina.

Jesús regresaba a Capernaúm después de viajar de incógnito por la provincia norteña de Galilea, evitando multitudes y enseñando a los apóstoles. Marcos presenta a Jesús dando tres predicciones sobre su próximo sufrimiento y muerte. La primera aparece en el capítulo 8, la segunda en el capítulo 9 y la tercera en el capítulo 10. La respuesta de los discípulos de Jesús a cada una de estas profecías fue una decepción para Jesús. Sus tres negativas a aceptar la verdad de lo que Jesús estaba profetizando surgieron de su suposición de que Jesús, por supuesto, iba a ser un mesías político, rico, poderoso y militar que inauguraría un reino terrenal donde ellos serían ricos y poderosos porque estaban muy cerca de él. Estos sueños ilusorios no permitían que sus mentes asumieran la realidad que Jesús les estaba enseñando: que el Reino nacería en Su sangre derramada en la cruz cuando Él voluntariamente entregó Su vida en sacrificio, para liberarnos a todos los seres humanos del pecado y la muerte.

Jesús dice que las personas que sirven humildemente son las más grandes. Utiliza un juego de palabras con una palabra aramea que puede significar tanto *siervo* como *niño*. Presentando a un niño ante ellos, Jesús explica que quien quiera ser el primero entre ellos debe ser un *siervo* de todos. La verdadera grandeza a la que ellos, y nosotros, estamos llamados, consiste en servir al prójimo y nunca es egocéntrica. En cambio, la verdadera grandeza reside en la capacidad de ver y responder a las necesidades de los demás, y presupone compasión y simpatía. Las dos condiciones de la verdadera grandeza a las que nos llama Jesús son la humildad y el servicio. Este llamado, vocación, al servicio humilde y amoroso pertenece a la Iglesia en su conjunto, y a cada miembro de la Iglesia individualmente.

Debemos llegar a ser grandes mediante el servicio humilde y abnegado. La grandeza, en la visión de Jesús, se encuentra en nuestra voluntad de aceptar, acoger y servir a quienes se consideran inaceptables por razón de clase, color, religión, idioma, riqueza o cultura. Debemos dar la bienvenida a las personas de la misma manera que un niño las recibe antes de que le enseñen a discriminar. Si hemos de ser verdaderamente grandes, debemos estar dispuestos a aceptar cuatro desafíos: (1) ponernos en último lugar, (2) ser el servidor de todos, (3) recibir a los seres humanos más insignificantes con amor, y (4) no esperar nada a cambio. “Aprendan de mí que soy manso y humilde de corazón”, nos dice Jesús a todos nosotros. “¿Qué es lo esencial en la religión y disciplina de Jesucristo?”, pregunta San Agustín, y luego responde: “Yo responderé: primero la humildad, segundo la humildad y tercero la humildad”. No debemos buscar reconocimiento y recompensa por los servicios que hacemos a Cristo y a la Iglesia como padres, maestros, pastores, etc. La fe confiada que resulta de la verdadera humildad es esencial para todas las obras de misericordia corporales y espirituales”. He aquí el lema de las Misioneras de la Caridad, la orden de monjas fundada por la Madre Teresa:

El fruto del Silencio es la Oración.

El fruto de la Oración es la Fe.

El fruto de la Fe es el Amor.

El fruto del Amor es el Servicio.

Y el fruto del Servicio es la Paz.

Que Dios los bendiga a todos. Amén.

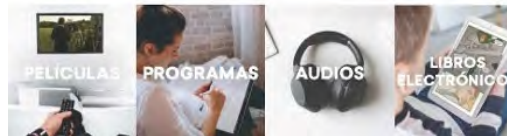
