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UNDERSTANDING THE BIBLE

The Bible is all around us. People hear Scripture readings in church. We have Good Samaritan (Luke 10) laws, welcome home the Prodigal Son (Luke 15), and look for the Promised Land (Exodus 3, Hebrews 11). Some biblical passages have become popular maxims, such as "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you (Matthew 7:12)," "Thou shalt not steal (Exodus 20:15), and "love thy neighbor" (Matthew 22:39).

Today's Catholic is called to take an intelligent, spiritual approach to the bible.

Listed here are 10 points for fruitful Scripture reading.

1. **Bible reading is for Catholics.** The Church encourages Catholics to make reading the Bible part of their daily prayer lives. Reading these inspired words, people grow deeper in their relationship with God and come to understand their place in the community God has called them to in himself.
2. **Prayer is the beginning and the end.** Reading the Bible is not like reading a novel or a history book. It should begin with a prayer asking the Holy Spirit to open our hearts and minds to the Word of God. Scripture reading should end with a prayer that this Word will bear fruit in our lives, helping us to become holier and more faithful people.
3. **Get the whole story!** When selecting a Bible, look for a Catholic edition. A Catholic edition will include the Church's complete list of sacred books along with introductions and notes for understanding the text. A Catholic edition will have an imprimatur notice on the back of the title page. An imprimatur indicates that the book is free of errors in Catholic doctrine.
4. **The Bible isn't a book. It's a library.** The Bible is a collection of 73 books written over the course of many centuries. The books include royal history, prophecy, poetry, challenging letters to struggling new faith communities, and believers' accounts of the preaching and passion of Jesus. Knowing the genre of the book you are reading will help you understand the literary tools the author is using and the meaning the author is trying to convey.
5. **Know what the Bible is – and what it isn't.** The Bible is the story of God's relationship with the people he has called to himself. It is not intended to be read as history text, a science book, or a political manifesto. In the Bible, God teaches us the truths that we need for the sake of our salvation.
6. **The sum is greater than the parts.** Read the Bible in context. What happens before and after – even in other books – helps us to understand the true meaning of the text.
7. **The Old relates to the New.** The Old Testament and the New Testament shed light on each other. While we read the Old Testament in light of the death and resurrection of Jesus, it has its own value as well. Together, these testaments help us to understand God's plan for human beings.
8. **You do not read alone.** By reading and reflecting on Sacred Scripture, Catholics join those faithful men and women who have taken God's Word to heart and put it into practice in their lives. We read the Bible within the tradition of the Church to benefit from the holiness and wisdom of all the faithful.
9. **What is God saying to me?** The Bible is not addressed only to long-dead people in a faraway land. It is addressed to each of us in our own unique situations. When we read, we need to understand what the text says and how the faithful have understood its meaning in the past. In light of this understanding, we then ask: What is God saying to me?
10. **Reading isn't enough.** If Scripture remains just words on a page, our work is not done. We need to meditate on the message and put it into action in our lives. Only then can the word be "living and effective." (Hebrews 4:12).

LITURGICAL NOTES FOR EASTER

Universal Norms

22. The fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday are celebrated in joy and exultation as one feast day, indeed as one "great Sunday." These are the days above all others in which the Alleluia is sung.
23. The Sundays of this time of year are considered to be Sundays of Easter and are called, after Easter Sunday itself, the Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh Sundays of Easter. This sacred period of fifty days concludes with Pentecost Sunday.
24. The first eight days of Easter Time constitute the Octave of Easter and are celebrated as Solemnities of the Lord.
25. On the fortieth day after Easter the Ascension of the Lord is celebrated, except where, not being observed as a Holyday of Obligation, it has been assigned to the Seventh Sunday of Easter (cf. no. 7).
26. The weekdays from the Ascension up to and including the Saturday before Pentecost prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Paraclete.

Liturgical Colors

The liturgical color for Easter is white. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (no. 346) also states: "On more solemn days, festive, that is, more precious, sacred vestments may be used even if not of the color of the day. The colors gold or silver may be worn on more solemn occasions in the Dioceses of the United States of America."

Especially during Easter Time, instead of the customary Penitential Act, the blessing and sprinkling of water may take place as a reminder of Baptism.

Ascension Thursday

There are six metropolitan sees and their suffragan Dioceses which maintain the Solemnity of the Ascension on Thursday: Boston, Hartford, Newark, New York, Omaha, and Philadelphia. Every other region of the United States has opted to transfer the Solemnity to the following Sunday (the Seventh Sunday of Easter).

Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen.

THE ASCENSION OF JESUS

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord was moved permanently from Thursday (May 26th) of the Sixth Week of Easter to Sunday, the Seventh Week of Easter (May 29th).

The Paschal Mystery culminates in the Ascension of Jesus. After his appearance here on earth in his risen body, and “after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen” (Acts 1:2), Jesus “was lifted up and a cloud took him from their sight” (Acts 1:9):

Christ’s ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus’ humanity into God’s heavenly domain, whence he will come again (cf. Acts 1:11). . . . Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father’s glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his Body, may live in the hope of one day being with him forever. Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all, intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit. (CCC, nos. 665-667)

NOTAS LITÚRGICAS PARA LA PASCUA

De las Normas universales sobre el año litúrgico y sobre el calendario:

22. Los cincuenta días que median entre el domingo de Resurrección y el domingo de Pentecostés se han de celebrar con alegría y júbilo, como si se tratara de un solo y único día festivo, como "un gran domingo". Éstos son los días más apropiados para el canto del Aleluya.
23. Los ocho primeros días del Tiempo Pascual constituyen la octava de Pascua y tienen la celebración como las solemnidades del Señor.
24. El día cuarenta después de la Pascua se celebra la Ascensión del Señor, salvo que allí donde no sea de precepto la Ascensión, se traslade al domingo VII de Pascua (cfr. n. 7).
25. Las ferias que van de la Ascensión al sábado antes de Pentecostés, inclusive, preparan para la venida del Espíritu Santo Paráclito.

El color litúrgico para la Pascua es blanco. La Institución General del Misal Romano (n. 346) también dice: "En los días más solemnes pueden emplearse vestiduras litúrgicas festivas o más nobles, aunque no correspondan al color del día. Los colores festivos (oro o plata) se pueden utilizar en ocasiones de mayor solemnidad en las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América".

Especialmente durante el Tiempo de Pascua, en lugar del Acto penitencial acostumbrado, se puede usar la aspersión con agua como recuerdo del Bautismo.

Hay seis sedes metropolitanas y sus diócesis sufragáneas que mantienen la solemnidad de la Ascensión en jueves: Boston, Filadelfia, Hartford, Newark, Nueva York y Omaha. Todas las demás regiones de los Estados Unidos han optado por trasferir la solemnidad al siguiente domingo (domingo VII de Pascua).

EL SIGNIFICADO DE LA EUCHARISTÍA EN LA VIDA DE LA IGLESIA)

La votación de los obispos la semana pasada comisionó al Comité de Doctrina de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de Estados Unidos para que redacte un documento educativo sobre la Eucaristía. La Eucaristía es la fuente y cumbre de la vida cristiana. La importancia de fomentar una comprensión cada vez más profunda de la belleza y el misterio de la Eucaristía en nuestras vidas no es un tema nuevo para los obispos. Este documento no tiene la intención de ser de naturaleza disciplinaria, ni está dirigido a ningún individuo o clase de personas en particular. Incluirá una sección sobre la enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre la responsabilidad de todo católico, incluidos los obispos, de vivir de acuerdo con la verdad, la bondad y la belleza de la Eucaristía que celebramos.
