THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS | *Henri Nouwen Society*

We often limit the Church to the organization of people who identify themselves clearly as its members. But the Church as all people belonging to Christ, as that body of witnesses who reveal the living Christ, reaches far beyond the boundaries of any human institution. As Jesus himself said: The Spirit "blows where it pleases" (John 3:8). The Spirit of Jesus can touch hearts wherever it wants; it is not restrained by any human limits.

There is a communion of saints witnessing to the risen Christ that reaches to the far ends of the world and even farther. It embraces people from long ago and far away. It is that immense community of men and women who through words and deeds have proclaimed and are proclaiming the Lordship of Jesus.

SAINTS, PEOPLE LIKE US | *Henri Nouwen Society*

Through baptism we become part of a family much larger than our biological family. It is a family of people "set apart" by God to be light in the darkness. These set-apart people are called saints.

Although we tend to think about saints as holy and pious, and picture them with halos above their heads and ecstatic gazes, true saints are much more accessible. They are men and women like us, who live ordinary lives and struggle with ordinary problems. What makes them saints is their clear and unwavering focus on God and God's people. REMUNERATION OF PRIESTS IN ACTIVE MINISTRY

Dear Parishioners,

After consultation and discussion, Bishop Soto has approved a revised Remuneration Policy for the Priests of the Diocese of Sacramento and promulgated it to be effective January 1, 2018. During the next few weeks, I will share with you some of the mains points.

The Remuneration of Priests in active ministry is broken into four categories:

1. Compensation
2. Benefits
- 3. Reimbursements**
4. Entitlements

REIMBURSEMENTS are generally non-taxable amounts paid to reimburse the Priest for certain expenses incurred in performing his ministry. Proper substantiation of reimbursed expenditures is required in order to qualify as a non-taxable employee expense reimbursement on a priest's personal tax returns. Expenditures eligible for reimbursement with proper substantiation include:

A. Automobile Expenses.

Priests in active ministry in the diocese of Sacramento have two options to cover their automobile expenses: Auto allowance and gas reimbursement. Priests can choose to submit receipts for their gasoline expenses incurred in their exercise of ministry. The above noted base compensation schedule includes the auto allowance amount.

OR

Mileage reimbursement. Priests can choose to not submit gasoline receipts for reimbursement, but instead submit request for mileage reimbursement. Source of income will pay for mileage submitted and incurred in the course of ministry (payed at the current diocesan rate). Priests will be able to choose one of the options either at the beginning of the fiscal year or at time of transfer to another parish. Under both options, car repair and maintenance are solely the responsibility of the Priest.

If a priest uses an automobile owned by the parish or his source of income then, 480 dollars will be deducted per month from his base compensation as an auto expense.

B. Auto Insurance. .

For a priest owning his own vehicle, source of income will reimburse the actual cost of insurance, not to exceed \$1,750 per fiscal year. A paid invoice must be submitted to the source of income in order to gain reimbursement. Priest may only apply for reimbursement for one vehicle only. Coverage limits must be the minimum requirement as detailed in Attachment "D". (*A portion of this reimbursement may be taxable to the extent that the auto is used for personal use.*)

C. Annual Diocesan Retreat .

Source of income reimburses at cost as substantiated.

D. Continuing Education .

Source of income reimburses up to a maximum \$1,500 per fiscal year. The last \$500 of the \$1,500 is given on a "matching funds" basis. This is construed to be theological continuing education; e.g. Priests Study Days. If a question arises as to the legitimacy of a particular educational expense, it is to be resolved by the director in charge of Continuing Education in the Diocese. Documented receipts must be provided for parish or other source of income records to gain reimbursement

E. Dry Cleaning.

Source of income reimburses documented expenditures for dry cleaning of clerical attire only. Expenditures for dry cleaning the personal clothing of a priest is a personal expense and is not reimbursable. It continues...

COME KING, JUDGE, LOVE, GOD!

"When the Son of Man comes in His glory, escorted by all the angels of heaven, He will sit upon His royal throne, and all the nations will be assembled before Him." —[Matthew 25:31-32](#)

Over 2,500 years ago, Ezekiel prophesied: "As for you, my sheep, says the Lord God, I will judge between one sheep and another, between rams and goats" ([Ez 34:17](#)). Jesus announced that it would be ultimately fulfilled at the end of the world when He comes again as the King of kings to judge the living and the dead ([Mt 25:32](#)).

On that last day, Jesus will say to some: "Come. You have My Father's blessing! Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the creation of the world" ([Mt 25:34](#)). Others will hear the terrifying words: "Out of My sight, you condemned, into that everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels!" ([Mt 25:41](#)) This Last Judgment will be based on:

- primarily God's grace, mercy, and love,
- what we've done for the least of the brethren ([Mt 25:40, 45](#)),
- our repentance (see [Mk 1:15](#)),
- our faith ([Eph 2:8](#)), and
- our love ([1 Cor 13:1-3](#); [Mt 22:37-39](#)).

In summary, King Jesus will judge us based on our doing of His Father's will ([Mt 7:21](#)) and whether we have lost our lives to be His disciples ([Lk 9:24](#)).

King Jesus is going to return to love and judge us. We don't know the day of His return ([Mt 25:13](#)). Therefore, it could be today. Are you ready for King Jesus' return? Are you looking forward to Judgment Day? (see [1 Jn 4:17](#)) Come, King Jesus!

Promise: "In Christ all will come to life again." —[1 Cor 15:22](#)

Praise: Crucified as King of the Jews, Jesus rose as King of kings. All hail, King Jesus! Alleluia!

HACIENDO CRISTIANOS | Continuación...

En las dos semanas previas hablábamos de dos [el Credo y los sacramentos] de los cuatro pilares en que se sostienen nuestra fe. En esta ocasión leeremos sobre el tercer pilar: la moralidad.

La oración (rezar la fe)

En una encuesta llevada a cabo hace unos años se le preguntó a personas felices en su matrimonio cuáles eran las diez características más importantes de un matrimonio feliz. Uno podría pensar que el sexo, dada la atención que se le dedica en nuestra cultura, sería el número uno. Pero esa no fue la respuesta. ¿Cuál fue el número uno? ¡La Comunicación! Las relaciones duran cuando se comunican. La oración es una forma mediante la que nos comunicamos con Dios. La comunicación es una calle de doble dirección: hablar y escuchar. A muchos de nosotros se nos enseñó que rezar es ‘hablar con Dios’. Pero esta es solo una parte de la dinámica de la oración. Si la oración se entendiese solamente como hablar con Dios, entonces la insistencia de San Pablo en que debemos ‘rezar siempre’ significaría que debiéramos de hablar a Dios constantemente. ¡Pobre Dios! ¡Imagina tener que escuchar a alguien que habla sin cesar! Cuando no escuchamos perdemos la oportunidad de oír la voz de Dios. La oración es el cuarto pilar de nuestra fe católica y que sin la oración corremos el riesgo de derrumbarnos, al igual que una mesa que solo tiene tres patas.

¿Y qué importa esto? ¿Qué le importa a un católico creer que los cristianos se hacen, no nacen? Es importante, porque significa que somos llamados a ser receptivos. La fe es algo que recibimos. No nos pertenece; se nos hace llegar como si fuera una reliquia familiar que atesoramos, protegemos y pasamos a los otros miembros de la familia. Ser receptivo significa pensar en Dios como el alfarero y en nosotros con la arcilla. Dios, a través de la Iglesia, nos da forma. La arcilla nos le dice al alfarero que forma quiere tener.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

México tiene la reputación de ser un país muy católico. Sin embargo, en 1917 México recibió una nueva constitución en la cual se estableció una política de intolerancia religiosa, especialmente en contra de la Iglesia católica romana. Con el paso de los años, se emitieron muchas leyes anticlericales mismas que fueron puestas en vigor hasta el punto que el gobierno federal decretó la suspensión de culto. Esto generó un levantamiento por parte de muchos mexicanos y mexicanas con el único fin de defender su religión y su derecho a celebrarla.

En marzo de 1925, estos mexicanos católicos movidos por el deseo de justicia, fundaron la Liga Nacional para la Defensa de la Libertad Religiosa. Ese mismo mes, el Papa Pío XI proclamó la Fiesta de Cristo Rey, celebrada el último domingo del año litúrgico. Esta fiesta se incluyó al calendario litúrgico para recordar a los cristianos —que no importa en qué país o bajo qué gobierno nos encontramos— pertenecemos a un solo poder, a un solo Señor, ¡un solo Rey! Inspirados por el grito “¡Viva Cristo Rey!”, miles de mexicanos dieron testimonio público de su fe y murieron con esta confesión de fe, justo antes de recibir el martirio, demostrando así que Jesús es verdaderamente el único Rey de sus vidas.

¡VEN REY, JUEZ, AMOR, DIOS!

“Cuando el Hijo del Hombre venga en su gloria, rodeado de todos los ángeles, se sentará en su trono glorioso y todas las naciones serán reunidas en su presencia” (Mateo 25:31-32).

Hace más de 2.500 años, Ezequiel profetizó: “En cuanto a ustedes, ovejas de mi rebaño, dice el Señor: Yo voy a juzgar entre oveja y oveja, entre carneros y chivos” (Ez 34:17). Jesús anunció que esto se cumpliría plenamente al fin del mundo cuando Él venga otra vez como Rey de reyes a juzgar a vivos y muertos (Mt 25:32).

En ese último día, Jesús dirá a algunos: “Vengan benditos de mi Padre, y reciban en herencia el Reino que les fue preparado desde el comienzo del mundo” (Mt 25:34). Otros escucharán las terribles palabras: “Aléjense de Mí, malditos; vayan al fuego eterno que fue preparado para el demonio y sus ángeles” (Mt 25: 41). El Juicio Final se basará en:

- principalmente la gracia, misericordia y amor de Dios,
- lo que hayamos hecho por el menor de los hermanos (Mt 25, 40, 45),
- nuestro arrepentimiento (ver Mc 1:15),
- nuestra fe (Ef 2:8), y
- nuestro amor (1 Co 13:1-3; Mt 22:37-39).

En resumen, el Rey Jesús nos juzgará con base en nuestra práctica de la voluntad de Su Padre (Mt 7:21) y si hemos entregado nuestras vidas como Sus discípulos (Lc 9:24).

El Rey Jesús volverá para amar y juzgarte. No sabes el día de Su regreso (Mt 25:13). Por lo tanto, podría ser hoy. ¿Estás listo para el regreso del Rey Jesús?

¿Esperas con gozo el Día del Juicio? (ver 1 Jn 4:17)

¡Ven, Rey Jesús!

Oración: Padre, que pueda estar contigo tan pronto como sea posible.

Promesa: “Todos revivirán en Cristo” (1 Co 15:22).
