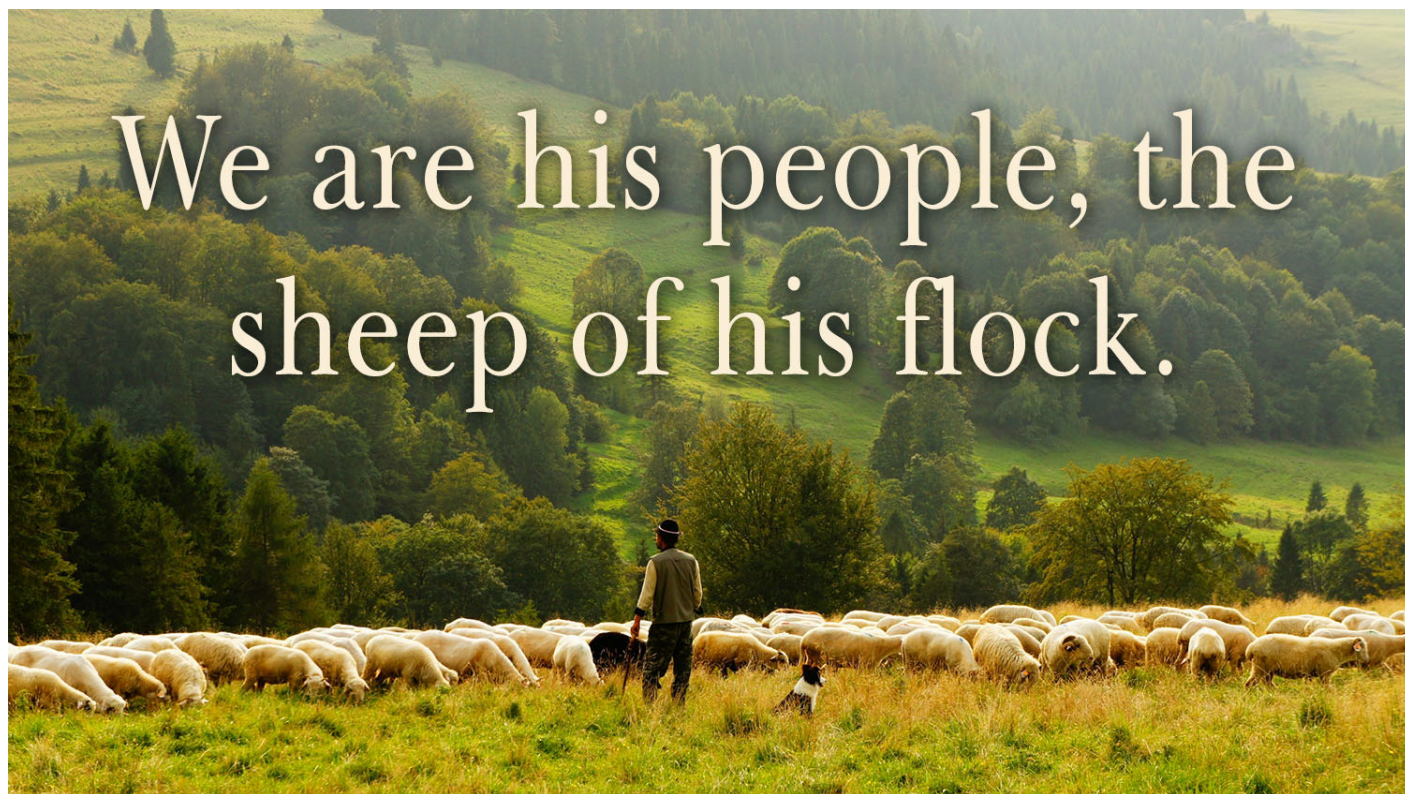

TOP TEN THINGS TO PROMOTE VOCATIONS

For all Catholics:

1. *Pray* for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. Jesus says in Matthew 9:38 "to beg the master of the harvest to send laborers into the vineyard." If we want more priests, sisters and brothers, we all need to ask.

2. *Teach young people how to pray.* Pope Benedict XVI said that unless we teach our youth how to pray, they will never hear God calling them into a deeper relationship with Him and into the discipleship of the Church.

3. *Invite* active young adults and teens to consider a vocation to the priesthood or consecrated life. A simple, sincere comment should not be underestimated. An easy way to do this can be remembered by four letters: ICNU. "John, I see in you (ICNU) the qualities that would make a good priest, and I want to encourage you to pray about it." It is a non-invasive way to encourage openness to a religious vocation.

4. *Make it attractive.* Show the priesthood for what it truly is – a call to be a spiritual father to the whole family of faith. Similarly, the consecrated life for a young woman is a call to be united to Christ in a unique way, and to be a spiritual mother to those she encounters in her life and service. The challenge for priests and religious is to be joyful models of their vocations.

5. *Preach it, brother!* Vocations must be talked about regularly if a "vocation culture" is to take root in parishes and homes. This means, first and foremost, the people need to hear about vocations from priests through homilies, prayers of the faithful, and discussions in the classroom. Vocations kept out of sight are out of mind.

For those considering a vocation:

6. *Practice the faith.* We all need to be reminded that the whole point of our lives is to grow in a deep, intimate and loving relationship with God. This is the first step for any young person desiring to discern any call in life.

7. *Enter into the Silence.* Silence is key to sanity and wholeness. We can only "hear" the voice of God if we are quiet. Take out the ear buds of your iPhone, iPod, and iTunes and listen to God, the great I AM. Young people should try to spend 15 minutes of quiet prayer each day – this is where you can begin to receive clear direction in your lives.

8. *Be a good disciple.* Some bishops say, "We do not have a vocation crisis; we have a discipleship crisis." Young people can become true followers of Jesus Christ by serving those around them. By discovering your call to discipleship, you also discover your particular call within the Church.

9. *Ask God.* Ask God what He wants for your life and know He only wants what is good for you. If, in fact, you are called to the priesthood or consecrated life, it will be the path to great joy and contentment.

10. *In the immortal words of a famous sneaker manufacturer: "Just do it!"* If you feel that God is inviting you to "try it out," apply to the seminary or religious order. Remember, the seminary or convent is a place of discernment. You will not be ordained or asked to profess vows for many years, providing ample opportunity to explore the possibility of a call to priesthood or religious life.

10 MYTHS OF ANNULMENTS

ANNULMENT MYTH #4: "Annulments are expensive. If you don't have the money, you cannot get one."

Truth: A formal case fee is \$600. However, no one is turned away due to lack of ability to pay.

ANNULMENT MYTH #5: "Once you submit the paperwork, it's a slam dunk!"

Truth: There are no guarantees about an annulment. Each case is looked at individually because each situation is different. Not all cases are created equal. Some cases are much more complicated than others. Not all cases submitted are granted annulments.

ANNULMENT MYTH #6: "If you are a big donor to the Church, an annulment is always granted."

Truth: Annulments cannot be bought. Donations, long-term participation in a parish, or being a "good Catholic" have no bearing on an annulment. One cannot "shop around" for an annulment; all tribunals follow the same procedures.

ANNULMENT MYTH #7: "It takes three to five years to get an annulment."

Truth: Most formal cases heard in the Sacramento Tribunal are finished in less than a year. Much depends on the participation of the parties and their witnesses to ensure a timely resolution to the case.

ANNULMENT MYTH #8: "Only Catholics need an annulment."

Truth: To marry a Catholic in the Church, both parties – whether Catholic or not – must be free to marry. Any and all previous marriages must be addressed. Persons who have divorced and remarried civilly without an annulment, and wish to become Catholic, must have their previous marriage(s) examined by the Tribunal before being baptized or received into the Church.

ANNULMENT MYTH #9: "A divorced person is excommunicated and cannot receive Communion without an annulment."

Truth: Divorced Catholics may receive Communion. Catholics who are divorced and remarried civilly without an annulment cannot receive Communion. In neither case are they excommunicated.

ANNULMENT MYTH #10: "If my former spouse does not participate, an annulment is impossible to get."

Truth: The former spouse has a right to participate in a case. However, if he/she does not participate in a formal case, the case still moves forward. Some types of cases do require the participation of the former spouse. Depending on your situation, the Tribunal determines the best possible way to proceed.

RELLENOS | “Los discípulos, por su parte, quedaron llenos de alegría y del Espíritu Santo” (Hechos 13:52)

Domingo, 8 de mayo de 2022; Cuarto domingo de Pascua

Hechos 13:14, 43-52; Salmos 100:1-3, 5; Apocalipsis 7:9, 14-17; Juan 10:27-30

¿Y si lo único que supieras hacer fuera es “estar lleno de gozo y del Espíritu Santo”? Después de que san Pablo y Bernabé fueron violentamente abusados y expulsados de la ciudad, los discípulos supieron reaccionar de una sola manera: no con violencia, miedo, falta de perdón o amargura, sino “con gozo y el Espíritu Santo”.

¿Y si fuéramos rechazados, insultados o acusados falsamente? Probablemente sabríamos reaccionar con algo más que alegría. Sin embargo, los primeros discípulos de Jesús podían estar llenos de gozo incluso en circunstancias terribles (Hch 5:41) porque también estaban llenos del Espíritu Santo.

El Espíritu crucifica nuestra carne con sus pasiones y deseos (Gál 5:24). Ya no sabemos cómo reaccionar a nuestras viejas formas carnales. El Espíritu clama “Abba” en nuestro corazón (Rom 8:15; Gál 4:6), proclama “Jesús es el Señor” (1 Co 12:3) y nos llena de amor (Rom 5:5). En estas circunstancias, perdonamos y amamos a nuestros enemigos y solo sabemos cómo llenarnos de gozo. Solo aquellos que están llenos del Espíritu pueden reaccionar a la persecución de esta manera. Por lo tanto, “felices si son ultrajados por el nombre de Cristo, porque el Espíritu de gloria, el Espíritu de Dios, reposa sobre ustedes” (1 Pe 4:14).

Oración: Padre, que pueda reaccionar ante mis enemigos de tal manera que desconcierte a los no cristianos.

Promesa: “Mis ovejas escuchan mi voz, Yo las conozco y ellas me siguen. Yo les doy vida eterna, y no perecerán jamás” (Jn 10:27-28).

Alabanza: “El Señor reina eternamente, reina tu Dios, Sion, a lo largo de las generaciones. ¡Aleluya!” (Sal 146:10). ¡Alabado sea Jesús resucitado!

ESCUCHA, ESCUCHA | “Nunca seguirán a un extraño, sino que huirán de él, porque no conocen su voz” (Juan 10:5).

Lunes, 9 de mayo de 2022 | Hechos 11:1-18; Salmos 42:2-3; 43:3-4; Juan 10:1-10

¿Alguna vez, sin saberlo, te pusiste en una situación que, en retrospectiva, definitivamente no era la voluntad de Dios? Obviamente, no estabas escuchando al Señor. Debe haberte advertido cientos de veces, pero debes haberte perdido una y otra vez. Esto parece indicar que la voz de Jesús te resulta extraña. Estás en problemas. Cuando no escuchas a Jesús, no escuchas la Palabra (Jn 1:1) y la Verdad (Jn 14:6). No escuchas al único que puede dirigir correctamente tu vida. Estás fuera de control.

Para escuchar al Señor, debemos:

1. Arrepentirnos de los pecados que afectan nuestro oído. Ir a Confesión.
2. Encomendarle totalmente nuestras vidas. Jesús dijo: “El que es de la verdad escucha Mi voz” (Jn 18:37).

6. Simplificar nuestro estilo de vida.
